Design Evolution

After becoming self-governing in 1923, revised "Admirals" were issued on 1 April 1924

SG 1 to SG14 Recess printed by Waterlows Line perf 14

Counter coils appeared in 1929, made up of joined vertical strips of 1d stamps, but **SG2a**, Line perf 12½






